TEACHING

Our experienced and qualified teachers and instructors are key to ensuring a successful Embassy Academy summer by creating a productive learning environment through engaging and dynamic lessons.

Students will receive 15 hours of English language tuition per week, following a structured curriculum to develop their core listening, speaking, reading and writing skills. Classrooms are equipped with interactive whiteboards and teachers use a variety of digital resources and software to make learning more

EXCURSIONS & ACTIVITIES

Enjoy exciting days out and discover England's rich cultural heritage. The locations of our Embassy Academy schools mean that students have the opportunity to easily visit some beautiful cities with amazing architecture, history and culture.

Excursions

Students at Warminster can visit the cathedral city of Salisbury, the Roman city of Bath and the world heritage site of Stonehenge. Roedean students are within easy reach of cosmopolitan London as well as trendy Brighton and historic Cambridge.

Students can also enjoy trips to parks such as Chessington World of Adventures or the beautiful grounds of Longleat Safari Park to stimulate their curiosity.

Students will learn in class about the cities and places they are going to visit to maximise the learning opportunity. This will include relevant and useful vocabulary for the trip, history of the destination, historical importance and cultural significance.

Included in an Embassy Academy course:

2 full-day excursions at the weekend and 1 half-day excursion during the week to a place of local interest.

Activities

Continue learning and making friends once the classes have finished with our fun and educational activities.

Activities are organised every evening to ensure students make friends, continue to put their English into practice, as well as develop important life skills such as teamwork, leadership, creativity and confidence

4 afternoons a week, students will spend an hour in a whole-school activity which is a great opportunity for existing students to meet new starters that have arrived that week and catch up with friends they have already made.

Evening activities range from talent shows and cabaret where students can demonstrate their creativity, to quizzes and games which require students to use their teamwork and problem-solving skills

Students can also choose to participate in sports which will often be available, using the indoor sports facilities or swimming pool





STUDENT WELFARE

Making sure students feel at home.

We place the highest priority on care and supervision at our Academy schools to ensure students feel relaxed, comfortable and supported. We have an excellent staff to student ratio of 1:5.

Student care and welfare

The accommodation is made up of various boarding houses and mostly shared rooms that are homely and comfortable and give students a chance to make new friends.

Each boarding house has a house parent who builds relationships with all the students in that house, waking them up each day, making sure they eat well and are happy and participating. Our students can talk to their house parent about any problems they may have.

A UK registered nurse visits regularly to address small medical needs. For other medical issues, we will transport the student to the nearest doctor or hospital.

Meals

A range of healthy British food and international cuisine is available at our Academy schools with 3 meals served per day. Additional snacks and drinks are also available twice a day during the break time. On full-day excursions packed lunches will be provided.

Meet-and-greet upon arrival

Embassy Academy provides a dedicated meet-and-greet, and transfer service for all students to ensure their comfort and safety.

Departure transfer

We provide a departure transfer for all students and our team will also assist students checking in at the airport.

24-hour support

Anyone who has questions or needs any kind of support can speak to our staff at the centre, or contact our dedicated Academy 24-hour emergency telephone number.

StudyCare insurance

All students travelling abroad must have adequate insurance in case of a medical or other emergency. Embassy Academy offers a comprehensive insurance policy called StudyCare, which is specifically designed to meet the needs of international students.

Students who book onto this programme will be asked to take a short online level test in advance to verify they are intermediate level. If their level is seen to be less than intermediate, we will recommend an alternative, such as Intensive English.

Terms and conditions

1. Payment of Fees

All fees including enrolment fees must be paid in full no later than 14 days before arrival. Transfers and accommodation will not be confirmed until all monies have been paid in full. No students will be allowed to participate in the programme unless payment is received in full prior to course commencement.

2. Services

Embassy reserves the right to change the particulars of the services, including changes to courses, locations accommodation, facilities and dates of the programmes where circumstances beyond Embassy's control necessitate such changes or where the number of bookings received does not reach the minimum numbers required to operate a course viably. The sample programmes featured in marketing materials are for illustrative purposes and Embassy reserves the right to change particulars without prior notice.

3. General Refund Policy

All refunds will be sent to the account of the Embassy representative to whom the fees were originally paid, or to the individual from whom Embassy has received the original direct payment. If a student's visa application is rejected after payment has been received all fees, excluding any cancellation fees detailed in the Cancellation Policy below, will be refunded within 28 days, provided a visa refusal letter is received by our International Admissions Centre at least two working days before the course is due to start and the student has fulfilled all requirements for a visa application. In the unlikely event that the school is unable to deliver a course in full, the student will be offered the refund amount in accordance with the above paragraph. The refund will be paid within 14 days of the day on which the course ceased being provided. Alternatively, the student may be offered enrolment in a suitable alternative course by the school at no extra cost. The student has the right to choose whether they would prefer a full refund of course fees, or to accept a place on another course. If they choose placement on another course, Embassy will ask them to sign a document to indicate acceptance of the placement.

4. Cancellation Policy

Embassy defines cancellation as the period prior to start of first course. All cancellations must be made in writing to our International Admissions Centre. The following refund policies apply. Refunds before Arrival: Where cancellations are received in writing more than 14 days before the first course start date 100% of package price will be refunded, but any application fee, courier fee, airport transfer fee are non-refundable. 6. Travel Details

Students that have booked an airport transfer must send details to our International Admissions Centre at least three full working days prior to their designated arrival time. If notice is not received Embassy may not be able to provide a transfer and will not be held liable for any issues arising as a result.

Once a written warning has been issued Embassy will contact the agent or guardian as soon as possible, allowing differences in time zones. Any student who has been issued with a written warning will be made fully aware that any further incidents will result in removal from the centre.

13. Expulsion

Students who have been issued with a written warning and continue to commit offences will be expelled from the centre. Embassy also reserves the right to immediately terminate the programme of any person or group whose behaviour is likely to cause distress, damage or danger to other participants, Embassy employees or other stakeholders. Embassy also reserves the right to immediately terminate the programme of any person or group whose behaviour is contrary to applicable local laws. This behaviour includes but is not limited to: under-age purchase or consumption of alcohol, possession of illegal substances, damage to property, threatening, violent or abusive behaviour. 
